Homework

- Pupils will have written homework in numeracy or literacy on 2 evenings each week usually Tuesday and Wednesday evenings
- On Monday evenings children have a 'Mental Strategies' Homework which is handed in on Friday
- Spellings & mental maths Monday, Tuesday & Wednesday.
- Revise tables/mental maths and spellings on Thursday for Friday test.
- Homework should last approximately 30- 45 minutes.
 As a parent we would ask that you work alongside your child for encouragement and support, but that you foster independence at every opportunity.
- Please listen to and discuss set reading with your child each evening. See label inside reading diary for strategies and tips. Please remember to sign your child's reading diary.

ICT

Your child will have access to iPads, cameras, computers and interactive whiteboards to support their learning throughout the year.

Topic work

Pupils in P7 will develop their scientific, geographical and historical knowledge in World Around Us (WAU) topics areas during the year, namely: The World, Technology and People. Please read and discuss aspects of these topic areas at every opportunity.

Pupils will also work on their <u>Thinking Skills and Personal Capabilities (TSPC)</u> throughout their topic work including: Working with Others, Being Creative, Managing Information, Problem Solving/Decision making and Self-Management. Again please encourage opportunities for your child to develop these skills at home as well. Ask your teacher for ideas if needed.

Numeracy


Your child will have a lot of knowledge and skills to work through in P3. They will need your on-going support. The areas of Numeracy in P3 are:

Number

Read/write numbers up to 500.

Counting forwards and backwards in 1s. 2s. 5s and 10s Ordering numbers –ascending and descending Know number before, after and in-between given numbers

Place value – how many hundreds, tens and units are in a number Number bonds for 10, 20, 100 Addition and subtraction mentally counting on and finding the difference.





Collecting and recording data into Tree, Venn and Carroll Diagrams and Bar Charts.

Interpreting information from Tree, Venn and Carroll Diagrams and Bar charts and using this information to answer questions.

Measure

Develop an understanding of length, weight and capacity.

Recognise when to use length, weight and capacity for measuring.

Use units: m, cm, L, kg

Time -days of the week, months of the year. Read

O'clock, half past, quarter to and quarter past on analogue clock. O'clock and half past digital times

Shape and Space

2D (square, rectangle, triangle,

circle, octagon, pentagon, hexagon) and 3D shapes (cube, cuboid, sphere, cone, pyramid, triangular prism)—key properties and features

Turning and direction - clockwise, anticlockwise, full and half turns, left and right

Literacy

There are lots of reading, writing, spelling and grammar activities in P3 and this work will also need your on-going support. The main areas are:

Spelling

Pupils will get spellings on Monday night. P3—P7 pupils will complete a variety of activities in school to help them learn the rules for Friday Test. They will need your daily support at home. See label inside spelling and tables book for strategies and support.

Reading

Pupils need to read at least 20 minutes each day. Guided reading activities take place with the teacher and comprehension development lessons. Please complete any reading homework and actively encourage reading at bedtime/other opportunities.

Writing, punctuation and grammar

We will be concentrating on correct formation of lower and upper case letters and writing on lines independently. The pupils will write in a wide variety of genres including poetry, recount, narrative etc



linked to their WAU topics. They will also complete activities in a range of grammar activities. Punctuation in P3 will use the following punctuation: . . ?!
